Cleaning: Frequent cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as (but not limited to) door handles, light switches, toys, and resources using appropriate cleaning products and methods Enhanced cleaning: Ensure surfaces that children and staff are touching, such as toys, books, doors, sinks, toilets are cleaned regularly throughout sessions (see enhanced cleaning checklist in Kitchen & Toilet).	Soft furnishing will be reduced with all soft furnishing that cannot be removed will be washed on a high heat or steam cleaned. Any blankets or cushions will be placed in a dissolvable wash bag and transported to the managers home and immediately washed on the highest heat possible for that fabric. O4.01.21- Antiviral fogging machine At the end of each day, along with enhanced cleaning procedures, the preschool will be fogged. A fogger is a device that creates a fog and containing a recommended antiviral fogging disinfectant to help kill enveloped viruses. 	Viro Kill (anti-viral solution) does not contain any harsh ingredients and can safely be used to treat and sanitise all hard surfaces and even most soft furnishings. It can kill 99.9% of pathogenic viruses in under 5 minutes.		
Visits from external agencies All visitations must be arranged with a member of management prior to visit. Visitors/professionals are asked to wash/sanitise their hands on arrival & exit, to wear a face mask at all times and remain socially distant where possible. Ensuring sufficient rest breaks for staff.			
Wearing gloves: Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job (for example, nappy changing), an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. Mask & Facial coverings: Only when isolating with a child on the outside veranda whilst waiting for parent to collect, you must wear PPE. Staff are aware of updated guidelines regarding wearing of masks when using public transport and in shops from 24.07.20	Staff to be reminded that wearing of gloves is not a substitute for good hand washing. All planned activities (e.g. Forest School & Park) should be risk assessed in light of coronavirus, in conjunction with relevant staff where applicable, and due consideration given to how usual practice may need to be adapted. Symptoms of Covid-19: If anyone becomes unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature in Preschool they must be sent home and advised to follow the staying at home guidance. If a child is awaiting collection, they should be moved, if possible, to a room where they can be isolated behind a closed door, with appropriate adult supervision. Ideally, a window should be opened for ventilation. If it is not possible to isolate them, move them to an area which is at least 2 metres away from other people. If they need to go to the bathroom while waiting to be collected, they should use a separate bathroom if possible. The bathroom should be cleaned and disinfected using standard cleaning products before being used by anyone else. In an emergency, call 999 if they are seriously ill or injured or their life is at risk.	Anyone displaying a temperature of 37.7 degrees and a above and/or new, persistent cough or whom report loss of taste and smell, will be denied entry to Pre-school and medical advice must be sought. Line managers will offer support to staff who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected.	All staff	June 2020



Do not visit the GP, pharmacy, urgent care centre or a hospital. If a member of staff has helped someone who was taken unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature, they do not need to go home unless they develop symptoms themselves. They should wash their hands thoroughly for 20 seconds after any contact with someone who is unwell. Cleaning with normal household disinfectant after someone with symptoms has left will reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members/parent of child during this time.
